For Porridge.—To one pint of *boiling water* add three tablespoonfuls of meal, shaking slowly in (through the fingers or a sieve), stirring constantly, and *boil for thirty minutes*. Eat with milk or cream, or with butter and sugar.

In boiling, milk may be used instead of water. The porridge may be made thicker or thinner, as desired, by changing the proportions of meal and water.

Gruel.—Boil quarter of a pound of Oatmeal, in two quarts of water, for thirty minutes; strain through a sieve, and boil the strained liquid ten minutes longer, on a slow fire; sweeten and spice, or salt, to suit the taste.

Oat Cakes or Scotch Farrels.— $\frac{3}{4}$ lbs. Oatmeal, $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. of flour, 1 oz. soda, 2 ozs cream of tartar, and $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. of lard—all properly rubbed and doughed with buttermilk, and baked in an oven.

The quality of porridge depends very much on the amount of boiling it receives. It cannot be too thoroughly boiled.

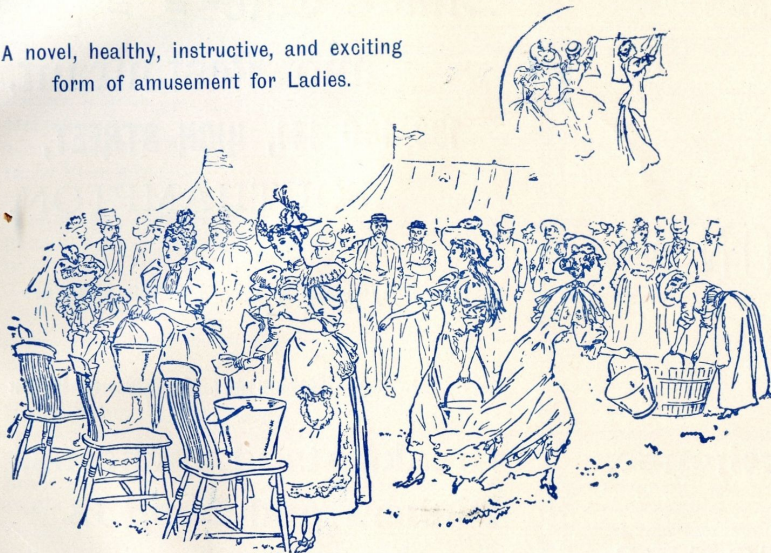
